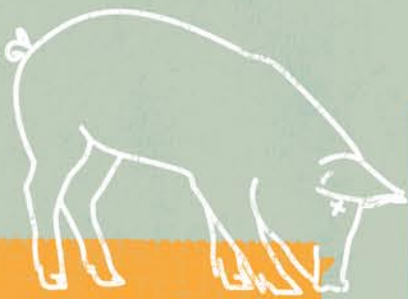
CITY OF LIGHT

AVOID LE TOURIST TRAP

ALL CRÊPES AND SIZES

For the best sweet or savory crêpes, we suggest heading to Montparnasse train station where some of the first (and tastiest) crêperies still stand.

LIBERTY LOOKALIKE

You're not seeing double. A one-fourth scale replica of the Statue of Liberty resides in front of the Eiffel Tower on the Seine, facing west toward her much larger sibling in New York City.
